Polish PM to EU: Don't lecture us on democracy

WARSAW: Polish Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki said Friday that nobody has the right to lecture his country on democracy, after the European Union said talks were still ongoing over the payment of billions of euros to bloc member Poland due to rule of law issues. "Nobody will teach us what democracy and rule of law are because Poland has a very long and noble history of fighting against all kinds of totalitarianism despots," Morawiecki said

on Facebook. "We fought for the rule of law and democracy during the terrible years of communism, but we have a much longer longer tradition of democracy and we do not want to be instructed by anyone in Western Europe about what democracy is, what the rule of law is, because we know better," the prime minister added. EU Commissioner for Economy Paolo Gentiloni said the Polish government's challenge to the primacy of EU law in the 27-member bloc was one issue under discussion ahead of the release of billions of euros in pandemic recovery funds to Poland.

New Zealand police gun down 'terrorist' as he stabs 6 people

PM Jacinda says this is a terror attack and the man was a Sri Lankan national

New Zealand authorities were so worried about an Islamic extremist they were following him around-theclock and were able to shoot and kill him within 60 seconds of him unleashing a frenzied knife attack that wounded six people Friday at an Auckland supermarket.

Three of the shoppers were taken to Auckland hospitals in critical condition, police said. Another was in serious condition, while two more were in moderate condition.

Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern said the incident was a terror attack. She said the man was a Sri Lankan national who was inspired by the Islamic State group and was well known to the nation's security agencies.

Ardern said she had been personally briefed on the man in the past but there had been no legal reason for him to be detained. "Had he done something that would have allowed us to put him into

prison, he would have been in prison," Ardern said.

The attack unfolded at about 2:40 p.m. at a Countdown supermarket in New Zealand's largest city.

EU FMs discuss coordinated engagement with Taliban

BRUSSELS: In a debate on Afghanistan, Foreign Ministers of the European Union (EU) discussed how to engage with the Taliban, in particular humanitarian aid and a possible tide of Afghan refugees.

"The purpose of the meeting is to try to reach an agreement on coordinated engagement with the Taliban on the basis of certain conditions, and on the possibilities of cooperation with regional players," the bloc's foreign policy chief Josep Borrell told journalists before the start of the informal meeting in Slovenia on Thursday. This does not mean recognition, Borrell stressed. "This requires coop-

eration with the Taliban." It is important for Germany to set certain conditions, such as the formation of an inclusive government, the protection of human rights and women's rights, and that Afghanistan does not again become a haven for terrorists, said German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas during the meeting. Luxembourg's For-

Pak closes Chaman Border with Af over security woes

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has closed its Chaman border with Afghanistan citing security concerns.

"We want peace and stability in Afghanistan. We have put up a fence on the border," the Pakistan Interior Minister Sheikh Rashid said, as quoted by The Express Tribune.

Rashid added that "due to some concerns" the border at Chaman was being closed temporarily. "However, we will not allow chaos to spread. There are no Americans left in Pakistan. Those who came have left", he said. Pedestrian traffic through Pakistan's south-western Chaman border crossing has swiftly increased after the Taliban's hostile takeover of Afghanistan over the last few weeks.

"About 18,000 people are now crossing the border on a daily basis," Hameed Ullah, the head of the Coronavirus Health team at the Chaman Border told CNN last month. Pakistan believes that the incoming "government" in Afghanistan would take "effective" measures against the banned Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan.

'Russia not keen on Af's disintegration'

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin on Friday said that Moscow is not interested in the disintegration of Afghanistan as there will be "no one to talk to". Putin stressed that many radical forces are present in Afghanistan apart from the Taliban. "Russia is not interested in disintegration of Afghanistan If it happens, there will be no one to talk to ... The sooner the Taliban join the so-called family of civilized peoples, the easier it will be to communicate, have influence and ask questions,"

Putin said.

More than 45 dead after Ida's remnants blindside Northeast

AT LEAST 23 PEOPLE DIED IN NEW JERSEY

NEW YORK: A stunned US East Coast faced a rising death toll, surging rivers and tornado damage Thursday after the remnants of Hurricane Ida walloped the region with record-breaking drowning more than 40 people in their homes and cars.

In a region that had been warned about potentially deadly flash flooding but hadn't braced for such a blow from the no-longer-hurricane, the storm killed at least 46 people from Maryland to Connecticut on Wednesday night and Thursday morning.

At least 23 people died in New Jersey, Democratic Gov. Phil Murphy said. At least 13 people were killed in New York City, police said, 11 of them in flooded basement apartments, which often serve as relatively affordable homes in one of the nation's most expensive housing markets. Suburban Westchester County reported three deaths.

Poland probes mushroom poisoning of Afghan evacuees

WARSAW: Prosecutors and police in central Poland are investigating the mushroom poisoning of an Afghan family evacuated from Kabul last month, including a 5year-old boy who died after the family made soup from death cap mushrooms they found in a Polish forest.

The boy's 6-year-old brother has undergone liver transplants, but doctors at Poland's main children's hospital said Friday that his survival prospects were very small. A 17-year-old sister was treated and reported to be in good condition.

The family of two adults and four children allegedly cooked soup with the highly poisonous mushrooms they found in the forest around a center where they were undergoing a mandatory quarantine. They entered the center in Podkowa Lesna, a town near Warsaw, on Aug. 23.

Prosecutors are questioning the center's staff as part of a criminal investigation that could lead to possible criminal charges for inadvertently exposing people to a serious threat of loss of health or life, Aleksandra Skrzyniarz, a spokesperson for the prosecutors' office in Warsaw, said.

60 migrants stuck on Belarus' borders

Minsk (Belarus): Some 60 migrants, mainly from Iraq and Afghanistan, are stuck on Belarus' borders with Poland and Latvia, Deputy Chairman of Belarusian Border Committee Roman Podlinev told Sputnik. "Currently, we know of four groups of refugees at the border -- two at the border with Latvia, two at the border with Poland. The total number of migrants in these groups is about 60 people, mostly citizens of Iraq and Afghanistan," Podlinev said.

Landslide claims 6 lives in Nepal

KATHMANDU: At least six people lost their lives while two are still missing in Western Nepal after a landslide triggered by heavy rainfall swept away houses early on Friday morning in Parbat district, local Police confirmed. Nepal has been recording a high number of casualties attributed to flooding and landslide disasters during the monsoon season annually. The monsoon rain pattern has again been activated in the Himalayan Nation.

S Arabia's female soldiers graduate

RIYADH: The first group of female Saudi Arabian soldiers graduated from the Armed Forces Womens Cadre Training Centre, after completing 14 weeks of basic training that began on May 30. According to an Arab News report on Thursday, the results of graduates, as well as the names of the most outstanding students and those who had been rewarded with prizes, were announced at a recentlyheld ceremony.

Nicaragua presidential aspirant to face trial

MANAGUA: One-time Nicaragua presidential aspirant Cristiana Chamorro and one of her brothers were among five people formally charged with money laundering on Thursday, prosecutors announced. In a statement, prosecutors said Chamorro, Pedro Joaquín Chamorro and three former employees of the Violeta Barrios de Chamorro Foundation will be tried for money laundering and other alleged crimes. Cristiana Chamorro has been under house arrest since June 2.

5 abducted students rescued in Nigeria

LAGOS (NIGERIA): Nigerian police said Thursday that they have rescued five of the 73 abducted students of a school in the country's northwestern state of Zamfara. The students were kidnapped by unidentified gunmen from their school in Kaya village on Wednesday. A police spokesman said the search and rescue mission is yielding positive results as five abducted female students were rescued on Thursday.

Israeli missile strike targets Damascus **DAMASCUS:** A fresh Israeli missile

strike targeted sites in Damascus on Friday, state news agency SANA said. The Syrian air defenses intercepted missiles over the southwestern countryside of Damascus as the sound of the interception was clearly heard in the capital, reports Xinhua. The Israeli strike was carried out from inside the Lebanese airspace, SANA reported, citing a military source.


